The Friends of Matheson Memorial Library held its 9th Annual Trick-or-Trivia fundraiser at Sperino's Monte Carlo Room on Saturday, October 22, 2022 with a sold-out crowd of over 200 attendees. Twenty teams competed for the title and Elkhorn team "Everyone Gets A Trophy!" winning top honors for the night. They also received the coveted attendee-voted "Best Team Theme" prize for the second year in a row.

The event raised over \$8,000 for the Matheson Memorial Library in Elkhorn to fund next year's Adult, Teen & Children's programming, as well as needed improvements around the library. Event co-chairs Katie James and Shelly Robinson were thrilled with the record-breaking donation result and are grateful for the continued interest in the event.

"Teams plan their costumes and look forward to this evening all year long. It's sold out seven times in a row! We're just so appreciative of the community's support of our home-grown event and the library," James said. "It's a festive evening to just hang out with friends and play some trivia. Our volunteers have a blast and our MC Bob Kordus keeps the night lively." Robinson added, "It's great to see our Elkhorn community have such a love for our library." Several community businesses, including Evergreen Golf Course, Mama T's, J. Robert's Menswear, Farmhouse Sweets, and Kwik Trip contributed raffle prizes to raise \$1,500. Frank's Piggly Wiggly donated a rare bottle of 12-yearold Pappy Van Winkle bourbon as a silent auction prize, with the winning bid claiming the coveted bottle for \$925. Sandy Kottke of Harvard, IL donated back her \$527 50/50 raffle prize winnings to the event as well.
